Vol. II, dated July 15, 2002, and is registered under the Societies Act XXI of 1860 with the Government of NCT, Delhi.

The National Institute of Social Defence is the nodal training and research institute in the field of social defence. Though social defence covers the entire gamut of activities and programmes for the protection of society, it is currently focusing on human resource development in the areas of drug abuse prevention, welfare of senior citizens and transgenders, beggary prevention, and other social defence issues.

GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACT & PAPER SUBMISSION

- The abstract of the paper should be up to 350 words & sent on mail id - elderlycare.lakshmibai2047@gmail.com
- Title of the paper and keywords must be mentioned in the abstract. The theme under which the abstract is to be considered should also be mentioned.
- After acceptance of the abstract, the contributors are required to send their full paper not exceeding 5000 words (including tables and figures, if required). The text should be typed in Times New Roman, 12-point font, with 1.5 inch margins on all sides, 1.15 line spacing, and must be double-spaced. The deadline for full paper submission is 18th September 2025. The paper should be sent to the Seminar Email ID: elderlycare.lakshmibai2047@gmail.com.
- Important Note (For Hindi Abstracts): Abstract written in Hindi must be typed only in Mangal (Unicode Font). Fonts such as Kruti Dev 010, Chanakya, or any other non-Unicode fonts will not be accepted.
- The cover page should contain the title of the paper, author's name and brief details including the designation, e-mail and contact numbers.
- References should be cited at the end of the paper. This list should mention only those sources cited in the text of the paper.
- All the tables and figures must be serially numbered.
- Authors would have to certify that the material is unpublished, as well as original. It is the responsibility of the authors to obtain permission to reprint previously published matter with copyright restrictions.
- Only submissions in English and Hindi will be considered. Correspondence and proofs for correction will be sent to first-named author.
